

## Competition Rules

1. The competition is open to all amateur photographers, including employees of Liverpool City Council (who should send photographs in from a personal e-mail account), and is free of charge.
2. Entrants can submit up to two photos either as prints or slides or digitally, in colour or black and white.
3. Images may be digitally enhanced to remove spots or scratches, but not manipulated. Entrants can enhance the picture to make it brighter, clearer etc, but not manipulate the content. Judges reserve the right to exclude any image they believe may have been excessively treated so as to alter its authenticity.
4. Each entry should be marked with name, address, contact telephone number and where the photo was taken.
5. The competition closes at midnight on Friday 10 September 2010.
6. No entries can be returned and proof of posting is not proof of receipt. The organisers accept no responsibility for entries lost, damaged or delayed in the post.
7. All entries will be judged by a panel of judges. The judges will select a shortlist of photographs (the 'Finalists') which, in their opinion, best illustrate the theme of the competition. They will consider a range of factors including composition, technical ability and originality. The judges' decisions will be final and no correspondence can be entered into.
8. All entries must be the original work of the entrant and must not infringe the rights of any other party. The entrants must be the sole owner of copyright in all photographs entered and must have obtained permission of any people featured in the entries or their parents/guardians if children under 16 are featured. Further, entrants must not have breached any laws when taking their photographs. Each entry retains the copyright but by entering the competition it is deemed that permission is granted to the Parks and Greenspaces section of Liverpool City Council to reproduce images at no fee for future promotional material.
9. Prior to submission, entrants must not have offered any of their entries for sale, been paid for any publication of any of their entries or won or been a runner up in any other photographic competition with any of their entries.
10. By entering, entrants will be deemed to have agreed to be bound by these rules and Liverpool City Council reserves the right to exclude any entry from the competition at any time and in its absolute discretion if the Council has reason to believe that an entrant has breached these rules
